2022	<p><b>Cocheco Academy of the Arts Charter School</b> <i>Epping, NH</i></p> <p>Cocheco Academy of the Arts was an arts-based, college preparatory high school serving grades 9-12. CATA’s Mission was “to provide excellence in secondary education, in core academics and performing arts, fine arts and technology related to the arts.”</p> <p>Closed June 2022 Declining enrollment; Facility challenges</p>
2021	<p><b>Making Community Connections (MC<sup>2</sup>)</b> <i>Manchester, NH</i></p> <p>Making Community Connections served grades 9-12 and worked together with families and communities to interrupt the predictive value of race, class, language, gender, and special capacities on student achievement. They worked to enable each individual student to become empowered with knowledge and skills to use their voice effectively and with integrity, preparing them for college, career, and life.</p> <p>Closed June 2021 Lack of enrollment</p> <p><b>PACE Career Academy Charter School</b> <i>Pembroke, NH</i></p> <p>PACE Career Academy was dedicated to supporting students to partner in the design of their personal growth, academic and career paths with a goal of becoming an essential part of their community and family. 2010	<p><b>New Hampshire Equestrian Academy Charter School</b> <i>Rochester, NH</i></p> <p>The Equestrian Academy Charter School was designed to meet the needs of high school students with specific interests in both college academic preparation and training in the equine industry.</p> <p>Closed June 2010 Lack of enrollment; Finances</p>
2008	<p><b>Franklin Career Charter Academy</b> <i>Franklin, NH</i></p> <p>Franklin Career Charter Academy was designed for at-risk students grades 9-12. It was originally designed to help students reach their own individual potential by embracing high self-expectations and developing their own positive vision for their future. Franklin Career Charter Academy was adapted from the Texton Chamber of Commerce Charter School in Providence, Rhode Island.</p> <p>Closed August 2008 Lack of enrollment; Finances</p>
