


Indicator B-8 Parent Survey

- The percent of parents with a child receiving special education services who report that schools facilitated parent involvement as a means of improving service and results for children with disabilities.
- This indicator supports the improvement of school and family partnerships .
- New Hampshire has four years of statistically significant results based on a scientifically valid and rigorous measurement .

Indicator 8: percentage of parents with a child receiving special education services that report schools facilitated parent involvement as a means of improving services and results for children with disabilities


Target for 2010 (2010-2011 school year) = 35%

Survey Results – Indicator 8 and Rasch Analysis

In 2011, there was a 3% increase in parent ratings on this parent involvement indicator. This represents continued significant improvement (18%) over the past four years.
