EverFi has created three web-based learning courses to support social studies teachers around the country. EverFi's partnership based model allows them to bring this technology and the necessary implementation support to schools at no cost. Below are descriptions of each of these resources:

[EverFi Financial Literacy](#) - This web-based program teaches high school students foundational personal finance skills. From saving and budgeting, to filling out taxes and preparing a FAFSA form, each student goes through the nine learning modules at their own pace as teachers track their learning through both pre and post-assessments. (Target Grades: 10-12; Length: 6-8 hours)

[Commons: Digital Town Square](#) - In partnership with iCivics, Justice Sandra Day O'Connor's national non-profit, EverFi created Commons to inform students of their individual rights and responsibilities and promote greater civic engagement. This five hour program addresses the different branches of government, the Bill of Rights, and uses primary source documents such as Washington's Farewell address to convey these American ideals. Students write an Op-Ed at the end of the program that identifies an issue within their community and incorporates the civic knowledge they gained through the online modules. (Target Grades: 8-10; Length: 5 hours)

[306: African American History](#) - This three hour web-based program brings history to life for students through immersive and engaging learning content that goes beyond just the facts of history. From examining the Transatlantic Slave Trade and the Dred Scott decision to learning about the artistic and athletic accomplishments of Charles Alston and Althea Gibson, students gain a much broader and more comprehensive understanding of the African-American story.
