Members of the legislature who were elected on November 2 will be sworn in on December 1. HEAC members Senator Molly Kelly and Representative Paul Ingbretson were re-elected. Representative Emma Rous did not run for office this term.

NH House

Deadlines

Monday, November 15, 2010	First day for all Representatives to file LSRs with complete information. 10 day sign off period begins
Friday, December 3, 2010 (3:00 p.m.)	Last day to file House LSRs with complete information
Wednesday, January 12, 2011 (noon)	Last day to sign off all House LSRs, including petitions, other than petitions involving the election qualifications of a member to serve in the House.
Wednesday, February 2, 2011	Last day to introduce HBs etc. and amend House Rules by majority vote.

From September 15 to October 1, incumbent House members who were on the ballot for the November election were able to file LSR's for legislation to be considered during the 2011 session.

NH Senate

Deadlines – Senate members were able to file legislation for the 2011 Senate Session beginning Wednesday, October 13. The rules do not show any cutoff date for filing or for signing off on legislation

Court Cases

The NH Supreme Court case 2009-0751, In the Matter of Martin F. Kurowski and Brenda A. Kurowski, does not appear on any list for oral arguments before either the full court or a 3 court panel, nor has any opinion been published at the website.
