

SUBJECT: Part B Grants to States Award for October 1, 2014

The Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2014 – P.L. 113-76, provided that part of the funds for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Section 611 Grants to States program become available on July 1, 2014 and the remainder on October 1, 2014. Last month, Congress passed a short-term continuing resolution (CR) that will provide funding for a number of Federal programs through December 11, 2014. The bill includes an across-the-board reduction of 0.0554 percent that, in addition to affecting the amounts available in fiscal year 2015 under the CR, also applies to the advance portion of fiscal year 2014 funds for four major Department of Education programs that was scheduled to become available on October 1, 2014. Consequently, the October 1 allocations for these programs—Title I LEA Grants, Title II State Grants, Career and Technical Education State Grants, and IDEA Grants—will be slightly lower than we had previously estimated.

Attached is the Part B Grants to States section 611 Grant Award Notification (GAN) containing the additional funds that became available for your State on October 1, 2014. Block 10 of the GAN addressed that allowable pre-award costs from the funds made available by this supplemental grant award. Please note that if special conditions were placed on your FFY 2014 Part B grant award from funds that became available for obligation to States on July 1, 2014, these conditions also apply to the supplemental grant award.




