**McKinney-Vento Homeless Education  
 ARRA Homeless Education Stimulus Funds  
 2009-2010**

**Eligibility**

Local Education Agencies (LEAs) that reported more than (>25) homeless students during the 2007-2008 school year on the end of year (EOY) i4see report submitted to the NH Department of Education, are eligible for ARRA funds to support students in homeless situations. An approved application for funds is required.

**Award Formula**

New Hampshire LEAs that reported more than 25 (>25) homeless students in 2007-2008 are eligible to receive a base award of \$ 5,000.00. In addition to the base award a (homeless) per-pupil amount of \$ 96.763 will be added to the grantee's base award for each homeless student identified above the qualifying minimum (>25).
