
#### **FFVP Training Topic:**

### Nutrition Education During National Nutrition Month!

March is National Nutrition
Month! This is a great incentive to
promote nutrition education in
your FFVP. Consider including
nutrition education through:

- Encouraging teachers to adapt existing lesson plans to include nutrition education.
- Having students create fruit and vegetable posters to decorate classroom and serving areas, if allowed.
- If you procure local fruits and vegetables for the program, ask a local farmer if they are willing to visit your school.
   Students love learning where their foods come from - a visit from a farmer will not only educate students but will also increase interest in FFVP.
- Utilizing school gardens as a learning opportunity. Involving students in the harvesting and growing process is a great educational opportunity!

Remember that in the FFVP, nutrition education must be offered on days when a cooked fresh vegetable is offered.
