

**Perkins V Update**

The State Plan for CTE process is in full swing! We’re compiling contacts for stakeholder groups, including CTE professionals, community members, and industry partners. Over the next year, representatives of these stakeholder groups will meet with the State Plan team, in order to get input on key parts of the State Plan. These key components include performance metrics and implementing a vision for CTE in New Hampshire.

Bureau of Career Development Education Consultants are available for one-hour information sessions. These sessions cover the basics of Perkins V, and include a side by side comparison of Perkins IV with the new iteration of the law. We can deliver them in-person, or by using Zoom. The presentations can be tailored to the needs of a variety of audiences, including: CTE teachers, school counselors, career counselors, school board members, district level administrators, parents, and any other audience a CTE center or community college may wish to reach with information about Perkins and CTE.
