RE: Eligibility Determinations for Children Suspected of Having a Visual Impairment

Including Blindness under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act

The New Hampshire Department of Education (NHDOE), Bureau of Special Education is providing OSEP Memorandum 17-05 issued by the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) to assist State Education Agencies and Local Educational Agencies in establishing procedures that further define the disability category "visual impairment including blindness" under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

The purpose of OSEP Memorandum 17-05 is to ensure broad dissemination of the key points made in OSEP's November 12, 2014 letter to provide additional guidance requested on this important issue and share information about outside resources that may be helpful as we examine New Hampshire's procedures related to the identification and evaluation of children suspected of having a visual impairment including blindness.
