AP® Credit Policies

New Hampshire Public Four-Year Colleges and Universities

Note: This document represents a snapshot of data available to the College Board as of March 2017.

Advanced Placement Program[®] (AP[®]) courses prepare students for success in postsecondary education and provide opportunities for them to earn college credit. AP Exam scores range from 1–5, with scores of 3–5 correlating to college course grades of C to A. Research shows that AP students who earn an exam score of 3 or higher generally perform as well or better in subsequent course work as compared to non-AP college students who completed the introductory course at a college or university.

Given the consistent findings that students who earn minimum AP Exam scores of 3 demonstrate college success, the College Board recommends that colleges and universities award credit for scores of 3 on any AP Exam.

Overview of Public University and College AP Credit & Placement Policies

As indicated on the following pages, AP Exam credit and placement policies vary by institution in New Hampshire. New Hampshire public four-year universities receiving the highest volume of AP scores last year:

- University of New Hampshire
- Plymouth State University
- Keene State University
- University of New Hampshire, Manchester

Of these institutions, none award credit for all AP Exams.

Of the New Hampshire public four-year institutions the College Board has identified, four award credit for AP Exam scores of 3+ for at least one STEM-related AP subject area.
