Purpose

The purpose of this document is to provide all subrecipients with information regarding the New Hampshire Department of Education (NHED), Office of ESEA Programs, Local Educational Agency (LEA) Title I, Part D Subpart 2 Application.

Guidance

The approval of a LEA Title I, Part D Subpart 2 Application by the NHED is a requirement for receiving Federal funding subgrants under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The LEA Title I, Part D Subpart 2 Application includes specific questions to be discussed with the locally operated correctional facility (LOCF) as outlined in the provisions included in ESEA.

ESEA SEC. 1423 requires that each LEA desiring assistance under Title I, Part D Subpart 2 shall submit an application to the State education agency (SEA), approved by the State education agency, that is developed with timely and meaningful consultation to discuss the needs of the students at the facility and outline the educational program to ensure that it will provide a high quality education to prepare the children and youth enrolled at the LOCF to ensure secondary school completion, vocational training, transitioning to higher education and/or employment services.

Per 2 CFR § 200.334 the request, form, supporting documentation, and NHED's response must be maintained for record retention purposes.



Local Educational Agency Title I, Part D Subpart 2 Application

To support the operation of local educational agency (LEA) programs that involve collaboration with locally operated correctional facilities, each LEA desiring assistance under this subpart shall submit an application to the State educational agency (SEA) that contains such information as New Hampshire Department of Education (NHED) may require as part of the application for Federal funding. Each component of each question must be addressed, if applicable, for the plan to be considered complete.

The LEA must submit their plan to NHED by emailing Melinda.M.Pfaff@doe.nh.gov and uploading the document to the grant page in the Grants Management System (GMS).
