

US Department of Agriculture (USDA) Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Public Release Announcement

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a USDA Summer Nutrition Program that was established to ensure that children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session. SFSP connects children with the nutrition they need to help them be healthy and ready to learn when they return to school. Free meals that meet federal nutrition guidelines are provided to all eligible children at approved SFSP meal sites. USDA’s Summer Nutrition Programs now provide more ways to reach more kids than ever before. Group meal sites for children, to-go and delivered meals in rural communities, and food benefits for purchasing groceries provide new opportunities to fight child hunger.

During program year 2025, children enrolled in a sponsored USDA participating Summer Food Service Program may be eligible to receive Free and Reduced-Price Meals benefits if your family’s income qualifies. A Foster Child and children who are members of a household receiving SNAP or TANF are automatically eligible to receive free meal benefits. Meals are available without regard to race, color, national origin, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), age, or disability.

The State Agency of the Summer Food Service Programs must publicly announce the availability of the Summer Food Service Program when the program begins (7CFR, Part 225.15 (e)). Each type of meal service (breakfast, lunch, supper, and snack) must be clearly advertised as to the date, time and locations where meals will be served.
