In New Hampshire, any child who obtains an overall composite score of **4.4 or below** is identified as an "English learner" (EL). Federal law requires public schools to offer a supplemental Language Instruction Educational Program (LIEP) or "EL program" for all eligible English learners. Based on your child's ELP test results, **your child is eligible for these services**.

As a parent/guardian, your input is critical in the decision-making process. You have the legal right to choose an EL program among those offered by the school or district or to decline those services. Below you will find an overview of the EL program types available to your student.

English Language Development: Direct English language instruction focused on developing academic vocabulary. Instruction may happen within the classroom as "push-in" support or students may be "pulled out" of the classroom for small group or 1:1 instruction that targets specific language goals.

<u>Content Classes with Integrated EL</u>: The EL and classroom teachers collaborate to use academic content as a means to support language development within the classroom.

<u>Structured English Immersion or Newcomer Program (SEI)</u>: Programs designed to meet the academic and transitional needs of newly arrived immigrants or for Students with Limited or Interrupted Formal Education (SLIFE). Typically, students attend these self-contained programs before they enter other types of EL programs. Often build foundational skills
