# Part 1 | Introduction Title II, Part A

## ***The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)***

Title II provides State Educational agencies and subgrants to LEAs

- 1.To improve the quality and effectiveness of teachers, principals, and other school leaders
- 2.To increase student achievement consistent with challenging State academic standards
- 3.To increase the number of teachers, principals, and other school leaders who are effective in improving student academic achievement in school
- 4.To provide, low-income and minority students greater access to effective teachers, principals, and other school leaders.

***ESEA Section 2001.[U.S.C.6601]***



## Part 2 | Definition of Professional Development

**PD activities** must be sustained activities that are intensive, collaborative, job-embedded, data-driven, and classroom-focused, and may include activities that improve and increase teachers':

- 1) knowledge of the academic subjects the teachers teach;
  - 2) understanding of how students learn.
- ❖ The key takeaway is that these activities can't be not ***stand-alone, 1-day, or short-term workshops.***

### Other Allowable Expenses:

- Memberships and Subscriptions
- Recruiting, Training, Hiring and Retaining Effective/ High Quality teachers: Example Teacher Residency Program
- Critical Shortage Areas
- Class size Reduction
- Increasing Teacher Effectiveness for Students with Disabilities and English Learners
- Personalized Professional Development

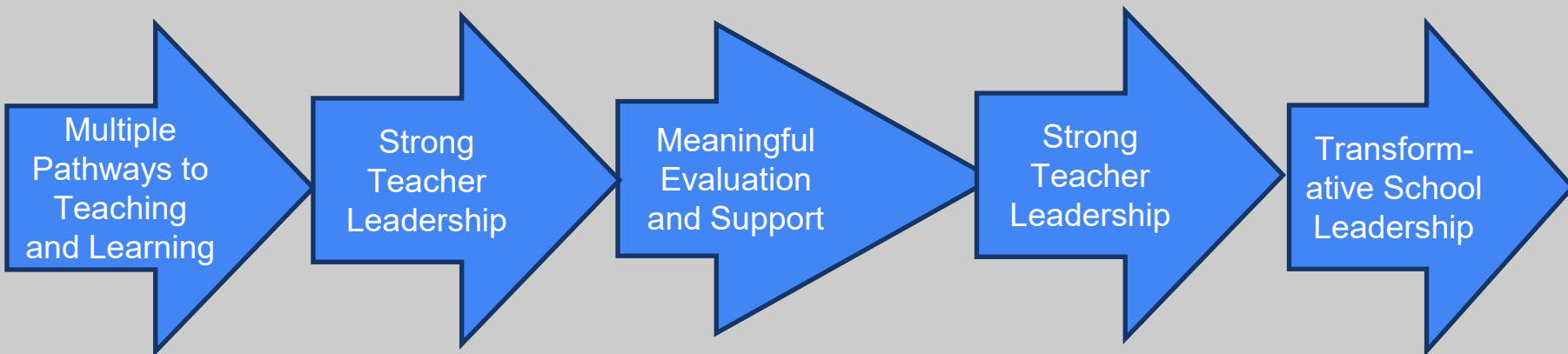
## *Part 3* | Other Allowable Uses of Title II Funds

- Supporting Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness

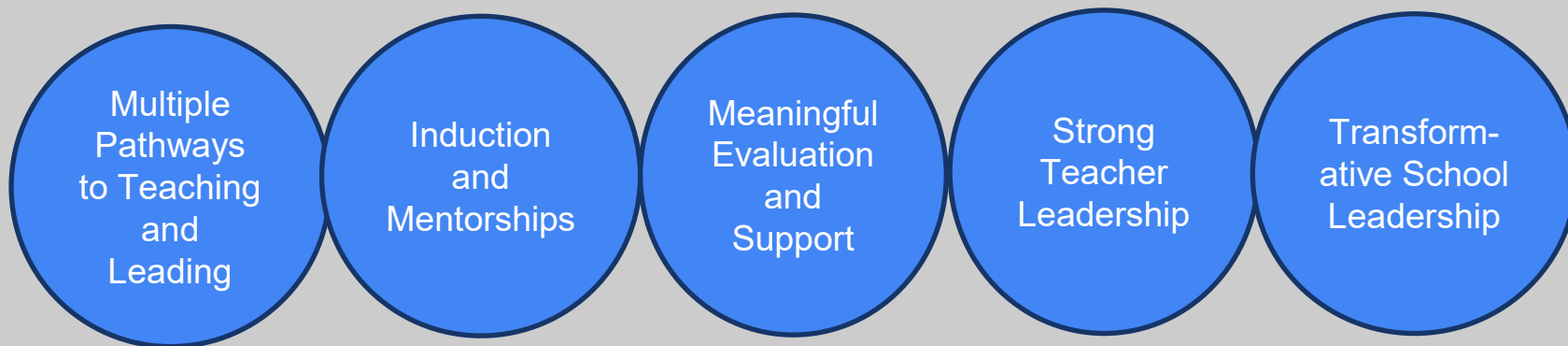
