 - ➤ Requires referral of Civil Rights complaints (involving CN) which cite one or more Federally-protected bases within 5 calendar days



What is discrimination in CN?

Different treatment which makes a distinction of one person or a group of persons from others, either intentionally, by neglect, or by the actions or lack of actions based on a protected class

Protected classes for Child Nutrition Programs

- ✓ Race
- ✓ Color
- National origin
- Age
- Sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation)
- Disability



2016 FNS / NH DOE MOU

Elements:

State agency CN program will refer ALL CN program Civil Rights complaints citing one or more Federally-protected bases.

CR Complaints citing State-level protected bases will be processed via the SA policy and procedures

Those that involve a combination of these will be forwarded to FNS/CRD who will review and notify complainant of how FNS will address those issues falling within FNS' jurisdiction



Documentation

FNS / NH DOE MOU has required complaint log elements

Civil Rights complaint information is not included in Child Nutrition case records



Complaint Forms

- Complaints may be written, verbal, or anonymous;
- ➤ For those complaints involving Federally-protected bases, we recommend use of the USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form (AD-3027)
 - > Contains all required elements necessary to efficiently assess the complaint.
- > State or local agencies may develop their own complaint forms; but the use of such forms cannot be a prerequisite for acceptance of a complaint.



What do I need to know?

- > Be familiar with State policy and procedures
 - Are there additional Civil Rights protected bases?
 - If so, what are the procedures for reporting?

- > Other areas to consider
 - Reprisal / Retaliation
 - Confidentiality
 - Separate Civil Rights Complaint Log



What's my Responsibility?

- Listen to individuals' concerns
- > Identify Civil Rights terminology when it is used
- Recognize that sometimes individuals never use the term "discrimination"

- Be prepared to explain the Nondiscrimination Policy and the procedure for filing a civil rights complaint
 - ✓ program rights and responsibilities
 - ✓ the policy of nondiscrimination
 - ✓ the procedure for filing a complaint



What if....

An individual makes a statement such as "I think you are taking too long to process my NSLP application."

An individual makes a statement such as "I think you are taking too long to process my NSLP application because of my race."



May I...?

➤ Require an individual who makes a statement indicating a desire to file a Civil Rights complaint speak with a manager to address their issue first before providing the Civil Rights policy or a complaint form?



May I...?

➤ No. You should first advise of the Civil Rights policy and procedure. Then you may offer the opportunity to speak with a manager. This may resolve the issue; and the person may choose not to file a Civil Rights complaint. (But they still may.)

Avoid becoming a barrier to an individual's right to file the complaint



Do I have to ...?

Complete the Civil Rights Complaint Form for an individual?



Do I have to ... ?

Maybe. The primary obligation is to provide the information / guidance regarding the policy of nondiscrimination and the process by which the individual may file a complaint.

➤ HOWEVER, if an individual indicates they require assistance – perhaps due to a disability or LEP status – you will be required to assist.
