 teacher who can speak for and bring energy to the teaching profession. Nominations will be
 accepted until Feb. 5.
- The Affordable Connectivity Program is a federal program that allows low-income families to get **free/reduced-priced broadband**. Although school districts cannot sign parents up for this benefit, there are new, customizable flyers that schools may share with families to promote this offer. Parents must sign up on their own.
- Free digital lessons on vaping prevention and resources to quit are available to schools here.
- The **Upper Valley Educators Institute** is offering a series of information sessions designed to help individuals become a teacher, principal, or teacher-learner, earn an advanced degree or simply advance their practice in education. Learn more here.

- NHED's Bureau of Adult Education has issued a Request for Applications for eligible Adult
 Education & Literacy programs to provide a 16-week pilot project using the STudent
 Achievement in Reading (STAR) program. STAR is an evidence-based reading instruction
 program for intermediate level adult learners. The applications are due Jan. 25, and the RFA
 application is available here.
- The U.S. Department of Energy's American-Made Energy CLASS (Champions Leading the Advancement of Sustainable Schools) Prize is designed to provide training and cash prizes to school district administration and facilities staff to make energy management a sustainable feature of their communities.
