- A revised <u>draft</u> of the **State ESSA plan** is now available for public comment; comments may be submitted to <u>accountability@doe.nh.gov</u> by Jan. 27. USED is currently allowing states to revise their federal accountability systems to better address the impact of pandemic-related disruptions. As such, NHED has drafted a revised State Plan to solidify previously approved modifications and to propose new changes that will enhance validity, reliability and inclusiveness of data used in New Hampshire's federal accountability system. The draft also includes updates relating to ESEA Title programs to better reflect current practices.
