- NHED has released its newest <u>cost per pupil data</u> for the 2022-2023 school year. The new statewide average operating **cost per pupil** of \$20,323 is a 4.8 percent increase from last year's average cost per pupil of \$19,400. Total expenditures for the 2022-2023 school year were more than \$3.8 billion in New Hampshire.
- NHED <u>announces</u> the selection of Richard Sala as the new director of the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation (VR New Hampshire).
