- Congratulations to Elizabeth Duclos, a third-grade teacher at Pembroke Hill School in Pembroke who was named <u>New Hampshire's 2024 Teacher of the Year</u> during a surprise assembly on Thursday.
- This week, NHED released comprehensive <u>statewide assessment data for the 2022-2023</u> <u>school year</u>. While preliminary <u>assessment results</u> were previously published in July at the state level only, the newly published data set provides information at the state, district and school levels.
- NHED has been awarded a <u>\$4 million grant</u> from the US Department of Education to enhance its school **finance data collection**, which will immensely improve its transparency.
- NHED issued two new technical advisories this week addressing the Chartered Public School
  Joint Legislative Oversight Committee and Chartered Public School Use of Unused District
  Facilities, as well as Technology Platforms in Career Exploration or CTE. All technical

- Per state law, all schools and child care facilities in NH must complete three rounds of lead in drinking water testing before June 30, 2024, with at least six months between each round. Action must be taken at locations that test at or above 5 ppb. To complete three rounds within the timeframe, schools should complete Round Two sampling by November 2023.
