


Friday Forum

- NH Homeland Security and Emergency Management has issued this <u>survey</u> for schools and other agencies to complete regarding impacts from the severe **storm and flooding** that began on Dec. 17. If you have trouble completing the survey, or if you have questions, please call 603-271-2231 or email <u>nhpa@dos.nh.gov</u>. Surveys should be completed by Dec. 27.
- Last week, NHED presented its 2023 <u>Charter School Annual Fall Report</u> to the State Board of Education. There are currently 35 approved **public charter schools** in the state, and student enrollment is up 35% since 2019.
- The NH Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC) will be hosting a free Internet and Digital Safety event for adults from 6-7:30 p.m. on Feb. 1 at Oyster River Middle School Concert Hall, 1 Coe Dr., Durham. The program includes information on how predators use social media, digital safety, a K-9 team demonstration, presentation by ICAC and Q&A. This event is not suitable for children.
- This week, NHED published its updated **data dictionary** for the 2024/2025 school year, which may be found on the iNHDEX <u>website</u>. A public review and district feedback period will run now until Jan. 18, after which the final requirements will be revised.
- Final reminder! Public charter schools that lease their facilities are eligible to apply for **lease** aid from NHED. Approved charter schools may receive aid of up to 30% of eligible costs or \$50,000, whichever is less. Charter schools that did not receive aid in the 23/24 school year, or whose lease has undergone substantive changes from last year would need to submit an <u>Initial Lease Aid Application</u>, which is due Jan. 1, 2024. Charter schools that received aid in the 23/24 school year, and whose lease has not undergone any substantive changes from last year, may submit a <u>Renewal Lease Aid Application</u>, which is due Sept. 1, 2024.

NHED is sponsoring a research project on student wellbeing and play in public elementary schools with child development researchers in the Boston College School of Social Work. The aim of the research project is to implement and evaluate two no-cost, school-based programs - Let Grow and Play Club - during the 2023-2024 academic year. The research will also measure student social, emotional and cognitive development.
