- NHED is announcing the <u>expansion</u> of its partnership with **Tutor.com**, which adds academic support and tutoring services for students in grades 4 and 5, as well as adult learners.
- Congratulations to Michael Blair of Manchester Central High and James Thibault of Winnisquam Regional High for being selected to represent New Hampshire in the <u>U.S. Senate</u> <u>Youth Program</u>.
- NHED received \$21 million in requests for the third round of the SAFE grants program. The
 Public School Infrastructure Commission met on Dec. 6 and approved \$9.7 million of SAFE
 grants. Schools that did not receive grants in rounds one or two were prioritized, and further
 funds were allocated on a first come first served basis. Grants will be reviewed by the Joint
 Legislative Fiscal Committee and Governor & Council likely early next year.

- A public hearing will be held at 12:30 p.m. on Dec. 14 at the State Board of Education meeting to discuss an <u>application</u> for the Landaff Blue School Innovation Plan.

- NHED has received notice of a <u>settlement agreement</u> reached in a class action lawsuit against McKinsey & Co., Inc. The <u>settlement</u> will result in a Public School District Opioid Recovery Trust, which will hold and distribute funds recovered from the opioid industry defendants. Class Member public schools may be eligible to apply for grants received from the Trust. More information may be found <u>here</u>. School districts should review the notice with local district counsel and determine appropriate action for their districts.
- NHED is sponsoring a research project on student wellbeing and play in public elementary schools with child development researchers in the Boston College School of Social Work. The aim of the research project is to implement and evaluate two no-cost, school-based programs, Let Grow and Play Club, during the 2023-2024 academic year. The research will also measure student social, emotional and cognitive development.
