- **iLearnNH** has launched a new [Training Catalogue](#). Please [contact iLearnNH](#) for free, small-group professional development sessions for K-12 educators across NH, including hands-on training in AI literacy, Canvas fundamentals, graphic design for educators, and 1:1 coaching support. Sessions are available in-person at schools or via Zoom, and can be customized for PLCs, departments or leadership teams.
- Join NHED's Bureau of Adult Education at 9 a.m. on March 18 for its **High School Equivalency Information for Schools** [webinar](#). We will be providing an overview of both the GED and the HiSET tests for school faculty and staff members. We will discuss the test contents, test preparation, paying for the test, registering, and other useful information.
- **MTSS-B Framework Training** for New Hampshire School-Level Teams will be available in March for schools that are preparing to implement MTSS-B or need a refresher. [Registration](#) is limited; training will take place on March 5, 14 and 20 at NHED in Concord.
- There are several days in the **Muslim calendar** with special religious significance, including the two Eid (holiday) days. Celebrating Eid requires that Muslims take at least one day off from school. We encourage schools to refrain from marking students absent for this religious obligation.
- To facilitate the transition from **i4see to iNHDEX**, i4see will be temporarily unavailable for the data migration from now until Feb.16. During this period, submissions will not be accepted to the i4see work queue, except for SASID requests. Student Rosters will be available to upload via iNHDEX, and the iNHDEX Test Harness will be available for testing school level submissions. After Feb. 16, iNHDEX will be the primary student data collection tool and i4see will no longer be used.
