

## Friday Forum

February 16, 2024

- During the previous legislative session, two bills that pertain to restraint and seclusion were passed into law SB 179 and HB 491. One of the significant changes to the law is that school districts are now required to use a State-developed restraint and seclusion form for purposes of documenting when a school employee utilizes restraint or seclusion. Pursuant to the law, this form was created by NHED and the Department of Health and Human Services in consultation with a group of stakeholders from the field. While this form is now required to be used by the field for documentation, these individual forms should not be submitted to NHED. Rather, in maintaining past practices and in accordance with the current law, these forms should be maintained by the field and the cumulative number of restraint and seclusions should be reported to NHED in the annual Safety Survey.
