- The NH Department of Energy has opened a <u>solicitation</u> for written public comment on its <u>School Energy Efficiency Development (SEED) Grant Program</u>. This federally funded competitive grant program offers a one-time grant to a public school for <u>energy efficiency</u> projects. Feedback from public schools, energy companies and the public is being sought on ways to improve the program. Written comments should be submitted by March 19, though comments will be accepted after that date.
- The American Battle Monuments Foundation is hosting its <u>Past Is Prologue Essay Contest</u>. Eligible students ages 11-18 may compete for prize money ranging from \$1,500 to \$10,000. Essays are due April 12.
