- The 2024 <u>Yass Prize</u> application is now live. The \$1 million **Yass Prize** for Sustainable, Transformational, Outstanding and Permissionless (STOP) education is considered the Pulitzer of education innovation. This year, 50 organizations will be chosen as semifinalists for the Yass Prize, each earning a minimum of \$200,000.
