- New Hampshire ranks <u>first in the nation</u> for the percentage of **Advanced Placement exams**taken by public school students in the Class of 2023 who scored in mid to top tiers. About 71
 percent of the state's recent graduates who participated in an AP exam earned either a three,
 four or five on at least one exam, which equates to 2,425 students earning average or high
 scores.
- Calling all high school students interested in a career in the skilled trades! NHED and College
 Guidance Network have partnered to bring Steve Turner, founder of Bring Back the Trades,
 to a webinar and Q/A at 7:30 p.m. on March 7. Attendees will hear about scholarship
 opportunities for career and technical education after high school, the most in-demand skills
 and more. Register here.
- UNH College of Professional Studies works closely with school districts statewide and NHED to support current and aspiring teachers with a range of degree and certificate programs. Its Professional Development Units support teachers currently working on Site-Based Licensing Plans or those seeking professional development. Scholarship opportunities are available in each content area, including special education, early childhood special education, mathematics (middle and upper levels), reading and writing specialist and teacher and emotional and behavioral disabilities.
- Derry Public Schools are hosting a <u>Group Data Conversation</u> for school and district administrators to explore school level reports in order to identify trends. It is also designed to engage in collaborative conversations around how schools are using **data to measure student growth** in Tier 1, 2, and 3. The event will take place from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. on March 21 at West Running Brook Middle School in Derry.
- NHED and **321 Insight** are hosting three, in-person <u>learning opportunities</u> at no cost to educators. These interactive workshops will look at best practices for addressing challenging student behavior. In addition, a <u>series</u> of virtual learning opportunities to support SEL and skill building will take place at 3:30 p.m. on March 7, 14 and 21.
- <u>Doodle for Google</u> is an annual contest where students in grades K-12 are invited to express their creativity by drawing their very own **Google Doodle** in response to a prompt. The winning Doodle will be displayed on the Google homepage for 24 hours and be awarded a college scholarship. Contest submissions run until March 14.

- The NH Department of Energy has opened a <u>solicitation</u> for written public comment on its <u>School Energy Efficiency Development (SEED) Grant Program</u>. This federally funded competitive grant program offers a one-time grant to a public school for <u>energy efficiency</u> projects. Feedback from public schools, energy companies and the public is being sought on ways to improve the program. Written comments should be submitted by March 19, though comments will be accepted after that date.
- A free professional development session for high school teachers is available. The Advanced Regenerative Manufacturing Institute is offering a PD opportunity for training in Bio-Trek a free, project-based learning program about regenerative medicine for teachers to implement with high school students. Attendance includes a stipend and certificate for 20 contact hours. Two sessions are available from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on June 24-27 and July 8-11. Register here.
- NHED is sponsoring a research project on student wellbeing and play in public elementary schools with child development researchers in the Boston College School of Social Work. The aim of the research project is to implement and evaluate two no-cost, school-based programs, Let Grow and Play Club, during the 2023-2024 academic year. The research team is also available to measure student social, emotional and cognitive development.
