- Congratulations to **Brandie Bolduc**, a teacher at Daniel J. Bakie Elementary School in Kingston, who has been chosen as the NH 2024 state finalist for the prestigious <u>Presidential</u> <u>Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching</u>.
- Efforts underway at NHED to ensure that students are receiving accessible educational content and that individuals with disabilities can secure meaningful educational opportunities are being <u>recognized</u> by national and local organizations.
- This week, NHED issued a <u>technical advisory</u> to ensure that districts are aware of their obligation to provide **one meal for each student**, including kindergarten and pre-kindergarten students, pursuant to RSA 189:11-a.
- US Secretary of Education Miguel Cardona recently released this <u>letter</u> regarding recent work to transform the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**) form.
- Keene State College is promoting its <u>Special Ed Administrator MEd/Post-Master's Certificate</u> program. Candidates may enroll in **degree tracks** or choose specific courses that meet their individual needs.

- A <u>public hearing</u> on the **ED 306 rules** (Minimum Standards for Public School Approval) for ED 306.01-306.25 will take place from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. on April 3 at 25 Hall St. in Concord. A public hearing on the second half of the ED 306 rules (306.31-306.46) will take place at 1 p.m. on April 11 at 25 Hall St. in Concord.
- Schoolhouse has launched its <u>registration</u> for free **May SAT bootcamps** in preparation for the May 4 SAT exam. These bootcamps cater to the new Digital SAT. Please share this information with your high school students and families; the deadline to register is April 3.
- This week, **Tutor.com** issued this <u>open letter</u> to NHED and New Hampshire school districts.

- NHED is hosting a required training in April 2024 to familiarize users with the foundation documents needed to prepare for the SSIS changeover from i4see to iNHDEX in January 2025. Topics that will be covered include: 24/25 Submission Layout Document, 24/25 Data Dictionary, high level overview of the training plan for SY 24/25, and other available documents and resources.
