- This week, NHED kicked off a [statewide literacy campaign](#) designed to foster the **love of reading**. While the campaign's primary goal is to encourage and promote reading among early learners and their parents and caregivers, the state also hopes to solidify and grow its reading proficiency. - Students in grades 5-8 are invited to participate in the annual **3M Young Scientist Challenge**, a nationwide competition for student innovators produced by 3M and Discovery Education. The challenge recognizes students who have demonstrated a passion for using science to solve everyday problems and improve the world around them. Entries are accepted at [Young Scientist Lab](#) until April 27.
- NHED and 321 Insight are once again partnering to offer a week of full-day, in-person **professional development sessions** designed to support all educators in their work. The morning session will focus on deepening understanding of supports and skills to help student learning. The afternoon session will focus on helping students build the skills they need to stay regulated. These sessions will be offered in locations throughout the state from March 20-23. - **Learn Everywhere spotlight!** The mission of [FIRST Robotics](#) is to inspire young people to be science and technology leaders and innovators by engaging them in exciting mentor-based programs. The programs are designed to build science, engineering, and technology skills aimed to inspire innovation and foster well-rounded life capabilities such as self-confidence, communication, and leadership.
- **Pandemic P-EBT benefits** are available through the Department of Health and Human Services to qualifying households with school-aged children for last summer. If you do not currently receive SNAP benefits and there are children in your household who are eligible for NSLP, you will need to complete an [application](#) between March 25 and April 24.
- Better Business Bureau Serving New Hampshire is awarding three, \$5,000 **scholarships** to qualifying students attending four-year colleges this year. - The Bureau of Adult Education is seeking proposals from school districts to provide an **adult high school program** provided through in-person, hybrid, Hyflex or online instructional

- The Bureau of Adult Education is seeking proposals from eligible providers to provide **integrated education and training programs** and/or integrated English literacy and civics education programs under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 for the period starting July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2026. Applications may include up to nine months of program design and planning prior to direct student services. The RFP is [here](#).
- Middle and high school students are invited to participate in this optional [Student Wellness Study](#) conducted by RMC Research. The **study** results will identify student perspectives that can assist administrators in making decisions to benefit school climate. No data or findings will be used for school or district accountability purposes.
