 federal COVID relief funds being spent in NH, now includes numerous other federal programs.

- The U.S. Department of Homeland Security and the Center for Prevention Programs and Partnerships has launched PreventionResourceFinder.gov, a new website that will help

prevent **targeted violence and terrorism** by giving the public easier access to available grants, research, training opportunities, and other resources across 17 federal agencies.

- MetaMetrics recently published its <u>State Impact Report for New Hampshire</u> to showcase the reach of Lexile and Quantile measures across the state. There are currently 522 NH educators registered on the Lexile & Quantile Hub.
- NHED will issue <u>competitive grants</u> to NH public and public chartered schools for funding the
 establishment of after school, before school or summer enrichment programming
 opportunities for students in K-12 for the 2022-2023 school year and 2023 summer. The
 primary purpose of these grants is to provide students in K-12 with the opportunity to
 participate in highly engaging, enrichment programming that supports students' social,
 emotional and academic needs in a before, after or summer school setting.
- NHED received a record number of Teacher of the Year applications for 2024. Following the
 nomination process, 92 applications were received more than double the number of
 applicants from last year. This pool of applicants will soon participate in a celebratory
 gathering before the selection committee works to narrow the field to semi-finalists.
- Learn Everywhere spotlight! XR Foundations Academy is an online course that prepares students with skills to begin creating meaningful Virtual Reality and Augmented Reality experiences for themselves and their communities. This program is approved to offer a certificate for one-half credit as an open elective in computer science to be applied toward high school graduation.
