- With snow days calculated, schools may find challenges in meeting the 180 day requirement. A waiver process is available to request a waiver of the school-year requirement. However, prior to requesting a waiver, schools must determine whether they can meet the school year requirement through hours, rather than days. Grades 1-6 must have 945 hours of instruction in the year, and grades 7-12 must have 990 hours of instruction. If you meet the total instructional hours, you will not need to satisfy the 180 day requirement and a waiver will not

be required. If a waiver is still required, the local school board must submit the waiver request to the Commissioner's Office.

- Enrollment for the 4th Annual Assistive Technology Expo is still open. As part of the NHED's NHAT Connect Project, vendors and educators are invited to join together from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on May 16 at 25 Hall St. in Concord. Participants will engage with at least 25 vendors and educators through presentations and demonstrations.
