- Elementary and early childhood educators will be <u>awarded a stipend</u> for helping New
  Hampshire children build a strong foundation to literacy. This week, Governor and Executive
  Council approved \$956,340 in federal funds to be distributed as **stipends** to eligible
  participants of the Lexia LETRS program.
- NH public and public charter schools are invited to apply for the Bridging the Gap in the 603:
   Pathways to Literacy Proficiency State Systemic Improvement Plan pilot beginning in the next school year. The Bureau of Special Education Support will be selecting up to eight schools to participate in the first cohort. Selected schools will receive training and coaching in the science of reading to support the implementation and sustainability of evidence-based literacy practices. Interested schools have until May 19 to apply.
- This week, the U.S. Department of Education's Student Privacy Policy Office issued two guidance documents to school officials to remind them of their obligations to protect student privacy under **FERPA**. Those are available <a href="here">here</a> and <a href="here">here</a>.
- NHED staff conducted two webinars this week offering a refresher training for Career &
   Technical Education data uploads. The next deadline is the End of Year submissions due June

- Project ECHO, a Dartmouth Health program, is offering an interactive, web-based learning series designed to provide tools for school staff, coaches and community youth leaders to better **support youth under stress** and in distress. Register here.

- Learn Everywhere spotlight! New Hampshire Academy of Science offers four science courses
  for high school credit in biology, AP biology, chemistry and physics. NHAS is an independent
  non-profit that offers a variety of science-based programs, including summer courses, afterschool programs and science lessons in conjunction with professional mentoring and handson research projects.
- A two-session series is being offered by the NH Department of Health and Human Services and Dartmouth Health for school personnel and others. <u>Effective Vaccine Advocacy</u>: <u>Protecting your Community's Health for School Staff</u> includes sessions on May 3 and May 10.
