- NHED is providing school officials with a letter that may be distributed to their school communities regarding a proposal to amend rules governing the Minimum Standards for Public Schools Approval, Ed 306. As part of this process, public input and feedback is being sought. Information sessions are being planned throughout the state to discuss the draft and gather insight. Here is a letter that may be shared explaining the process, which includes a link to the draft document.
- The New Hampshire Attorney General's Office has issued this <u>letter</u> to educational leaders regarding an investigation into **social media platforms** and their impact on young people.
   This topic will be discussed at noon on May 1 when a representative from the Attorney General's Office will be present during NHED's monthly Zoom call with school leaders.
- No Safe Experience is a comprehensive statewide campaign that is raising awareness of the
  dangers of fentanyl and its presence in fake pills and other illicit substances. A toolkit is now
  available to provide school districts with access to materials that could be used to help better
  educate our youth that there is "No Safe Experience" when it comes to using illicit

- The New Hampshire <u>Assistive Technology Expo</u> will take place from noon to 5 p.m. on May 10 at The Hotel Concord. Meet with **assistive technology** companies and specialists to learn more about their products and services.
- The NHSaves program offers public and private schools rebates and incentives for energyefficient projects. These include new construction and retrofits. The NHSaves program can
  help with projects related to HVAC, lighting, food service equipment, weatherization and

- Registration for Schoolhouse's June SAT Bootcamps in preparation for the June 3 SAT exam

   opens on April 24. Students and their parents may sign up here ahead of the May 3 registration deadline. The bootcamp is a four-week long tutoring series and research study to help students prepare for the upcoming SAT. Sessions take place twice a week, 75 minutes per session.
- NHED and **321 Insight** will host the last series of in-person professional development for the school year on May 16-18. The focus will be on trauma-informed practices and classroom

proven strategies to address challenging behavior. Sessions will take place on May 16 at Keene State College, May 17 at North Country Education Services in Gorham and May 18 at the NHED offices in Concord. Register by May 13.

- The <u>Yass Prize</u> is a movement to transform education. It is searching for education changemakers from all sectors of education private, charter, public and more who are delivering an education that is sustainable, transformational and outstanding. Applications are open until July 15; substantial cash prizes are awarded.
- NH public and public charter schools are invited to apply for the Bridging the Gap in the 603:
   Pathways to Literacy Proficiency State Systemic Improvement Plan pilot beginning in the next school year. The Bureau of Special Education Supports will be selecting up to eight schools to participate in the first cohort. Selected schools will receive training and coaching in the science of reading to support the implementation and sustainability of evidence-based literacy practices. Interested schools have until May 19 to apply.

It offers private, weekly music instruction in a fun and family-oriented environment, as well as a range of instrument, voice, composition and sound technology certificates that provide school credit to high school students.
