  to college and career guidance for every high school student in the state, as well as their
  families and school counselors. Schools may register here.

   Aaron Joy of Phillips Exeter Academy and Sora S. Shirai of Hanover High School. These two students were among a cohort of 161 high school seniors being recognized for their accomplishments in academics.
- The NH Excellence in Education Awards Board has announced the selection of the 2023
   Schools of Excellence award winners. Congratulations to Swasey Central School in
   Brentwood, Chester Academy in Chester, Merrimack Valley Middle School in Penacook and
   Pembroke Academy in Pembroke for being recognized as meeting high standards of
   excellence.
- PerformancePlus (Performance Tracker) will be sunsetting on June 30 as the result of the vendor's (Powerschool) decision to end service and support to PerformancePlus. We know that many schools and districts access PerformancePlus through MyNHDOE and we are working to find a new solution that will continue to provide access to statewide assessment data and analysis. In the meantime, you may visit <u>iPlatform</u> on the Department's website for state, district and local assessment data and analysis and, as always, you will continue to have access to student-specific assessment data and results through the various assessment administration platforms (TIDE, etc.).
- End of year i4see reporting will go live on May 15. Submissions for EOY enrollment, free and reduced meals and home school data must be batch verified no later than June 23 and certified by the superintendent no later than July 7. Other submissions, including college and career readiness and civics, EOY academics, credits and GPA, extended learning opportunities and virtual instruction/remote learning must be batch verified by July 31 and certified by the superintendent no later than Aug. 11.

- The National Center for Competency Based Learning is hosting a series of <u>listening sessions</u> on the proposed draft of the Ed 306 rules (Minimum Standards for Public Schools Approval).
   At least nine sessions have been scheduled and more are in the process of being planned.
