The rules and guidelines have been revamped, the topics have been aligned with third-grade standards and a rubric has been added for scoring. - Please review this [document](#) on the **USDA Approved Waivers** for Summer 2022 and SY 2022-2023 Child Nutrition Programs. As a reminder, free meals are ending June 30, and the waivers on this list are the only waivers that will be available.
- The DHHS **Over the Counter COVID-19 Antigen Test Program** has resumed, and orders previously submitted are now in the process of being filled. These FlowFlex rapid antigen tests are available to daycares, federally qualified healthcare centers, regional public health networks, K-12 schools, and summer camps. - NHED announces a 2022 **Modern Band [request for applications](#)** from school music programs wanting to initiate or expand modern band programming in their school. NHED will offer at least 18 teachers two days of in-state, face-to-face training in modern band pedagogy, as well as \$2,500 for purchasing instruments.
