- NHED is pleased to announce that it has completed the first year of its Unified Co-Curricular
 Activities grants to schools (following legislation that was passed last year). We disbursed
 \$49,415 of the \$50,000 allotted to this grant, and supported 16 new activities and two
 existing activities; those activities include soccer, theater, robotics, basketball, volleyball,
 spirit, track and field, and physical and emotional fitness.

- End of year i4see reporting is now live. Submissions for EOY enrollment, free and reduced
 meals and home school data must be batch verified no later than June 23 and certified by the
 superintendent no later than July 7. Other submissions, including college and career
 readiness and civics, EOY academics, credits and GPA, extended learning opportunities and
 virtual instruction/remote learning must be batch verified by July 31 and certified by the
 superintendent no later than Aug. 11.
- Learn Everywhere Spotlight! XR Terra offers XR Foundations Academy an online, immersive course that prepares students with skills to begin creating meaningful virtual reality and augmented reality experiences for themselves and their communities. This program is approved to offer a certificate for one-half credit as an open elective in computer science to be applied toward high school graduation.
- NHED has awarded nearly \$800,000 for this summer's ReKINDling Curiosity program –
 hoping to ensure that every child who wants to attend a fun and engaging summer camp has
 the opportunity. This <u>flyer</u> outlines scholarship and eligibility information. Applications will be
 accepted until Aug. 31, or when funds are exhausted.
