- NHED's ReKINDling Curiosity program reached a major milestone in June providing more than \$1 million in **camp fees** to families that might otherwise not have the resources to send their children to summer camp. Applications are still open for this summer.
- Deadline extended until Aug. 11! Applications have been reopened and documents have been updated for the <u>Stronger Connections Grant Opportunity</u> to support <u>safe learning</u> <u>environments</u>. LEAs must utilize the updated documents; applications will be considered incomplete if the old forms are used. Please be mindful that this grant is subject to equitable services, which must occur prior to the application submission.
- For any approved public chartered schools that intend to submit **Renewal Lease Aid** applications, please remember that the deadline to submit is Sept. 1. The application may be found on the Bureau of Facilities webpage here.
- The annual Summer Educators Institute will take place Aug. 10 at Keene State College. This
 event is free to participants. You may <u>register</u> yourself or multiple attendees from your

- The Library of Congress is sponsoring a challenge to help improve public knowledge of civics
 –the rights and responsibilities of citizens by asking video game developers to create fun
