- Governor Chris Sununu has issued a <u>proclamation</u>, which proclaims September 2023 as **Welcoming Schools Month**.
- The September Search Institute <u>Professional Development Series</u> is free, and will focus on Building a Foundation of Trust with Parenting Adults. Sessions take place on Sept. 12 and Sept. 19.
