- NHED has <u>renewed</u> 8,154 educator credentials so far in 2023, which is the third-highest number of **annual renewals** in the past decade.
- This week, the State Board of Education <u>approved</u> a new **Learn Everywhere** program with PragerU that will provide an optional mechanism for NH students to help in obtaining their financial literacy requirement for high school graduation.
- **LifeVac** has announced that for the month of September, it will donate one free LifeVac to every school in the country. LifeVac is known for its lifesaving airway clearance device, which is used in the case of an emergency choking situation. Administrators are encouraged to order a free kit online <a href="here">here</a>. This request must be made by a school administrator through an official school email.
- The deadline for nominations for the US Senate Youth Program is Oct. 14. Each high school principal may nominate one eligible junior or senior student. Two students from each state will be selected to attend the USSYP Washington Week March 4-11, 2023 and receive a \$10,000 scholarship. More details <a href="here">here</a>.
- The **US Presidential Scholars Program** is accepting nominees until Nov. 13. Each school may nominate up to three students one male and one female for general studies and one student to be included as a candidate for recognition for excellence in CTE. More details <a href="here">here</a>.
- The <u>NEA Fall Instructional Conference</u> will be held Oct. 6 at Bow High School, and is open to all public school educators and their professional colleagues. This year's theme is "Improving School Health" and will offer more than 80 workshops. The registration deadline is Sept. 24.

- In accordance with recommendations from Governor Sununu's School Safety Task Force, the NH Information & Analysis Center has developed an annual <u>School Safety and Security</u> <u>Bulletin</u> that provides schools with the latest **safety and security** related information.
- Pandemic-EBT SNAP benefits are available for eligible households for summer 2023. Please
  help spread the word to your school families. Households that participated in the National
  School Lunch Program, free or reduced meals, those children may be eligible for P-EBT for
  July-August 2023. If you currently receive SNAP benefits and children in your household are
  eligible for NSLP at their school, you will be automatically eligible for these benefits and do
  not need to apply; benefits will go to your current EBT card in early November. For families
  that do NOT currently receive SNAP benefits and children in that household were determined
  eligible for NSLP at their school, they will need to complete a brief application here from Sept.
  30 to Nov. 30.

- This past April, FEMA announced the end of the incident period for the COVID-19 Disaster for
  the FEMA Pubic Assistance funding. The incident period for the COVID Disaster ended on May
  11. This was the deadline for all eligible completed work to be reimbursed at a 90% federal
  cost share. These 90% cost share projects must be completed and submitted to the Covid
  Recovery Section at HSEM prior to Oct. 17. HSEM encourages you to work with its office,
  DOS.NHPA@dos.nh.gov, prior to this date if you are pursuing additional funding.
