## *Friday Forum*

Sept. 16, 2022

- About \$13.9 million in state and federal funds have been approved for **SAFE grant projects**. This will be awarded in two phases - \$3.9 million (state funds) in the early decision phase, followed by \$10 million (federal funds) in the second phase. The early decision awards were announced Sept. 9 and are available [here](#). In the early phase, more than 500 applications, requesting about \$18.5 million, were received and risk-ranked. Of those, 92 schools were selected to receive a SAFE grant, totaling \$3.9 million. All awards will be managed through NHED's Grants Management System. Instructions for next steps will be sent to first round awardees in the coming weeks. Projects not funded in the first round will automatically be considered for the \$10 million in federal funds. In total, 1,060 SAFE grant applications were received, requesting more than \$35 million. NHED anticipates that the recommendations for the second round of awards will go to the PSI Commission and the Governor for approval in October, to Joint Legislative Fiscal Committee and G&C for approval in November, with award notifications announced in Dec./Jan.
