RE: Special Education Administrators Mentoring Program

The New Hampshire Department of Education (NHED), Bureau of Special Education Support is offering a mentoring program to new district Special Education Administrators for the 2023-2024 school year. The intent of the mentoring program is to support individuals who are certified, or using an alternative pathway to certification, and new to the role of District Special Education Director. This project is a scaling up of the Bureau's previous efforts to support individuals who are new to the position of Special Education Administrator.

The Bureau is seeking twelve experienced New Hampshire School District Administrators of Special Education who are currently employed by a New Hampshire school district to receive training, and act as mentors through the 2023-2024 school year (August 2023–August 2024) for New Hampshire Administrators of Special Education that apply to be mentees.

The responsibilities of a mentor are:

- Attend a training provided by Bureau staff on Tuesday, August 22, 2023, from 9am – 1pm at the NHED (location to be determined) along with your assigned mentee, which will cover the following information.
 - Benefits of Mentoring
 - Mentoring Goals
 - Effective Leadership
 - Administrative Processes
 - LEA Determinations
 - Facilitation of Special Education Team Meetings
 - Special Education Complaint Process
 - Alternative Dispute Resolution
 - Administrative Due Process Hearing
 - Fiscal Management
 - IDEA Funds
 - Maintenance of Effort & Excess Cost
 - Parentally Placed

- Special Education Aid
 - Chapter 402 Program for Court-ordered Students
 - Educational Surrogate Parent
 - Understanding State Monitoring
 - Special Education Program Approval
 - Expectations of the Mentor/Mentee
 - Roles & Responsibilities
- Work with your mentee at least twice a month either in person, or by phone, webinar, skype, etc.
- Participate in an optional mid-year meeting on Friday, January 26, 2024, 9am–11am via zoom, which will include:
 - Special Topic Presentation
 - Mentor/Mentee Meeting Time if time allows
- Attend a wrap-up meeting with your assigned mentee on Tuesday, June 18, 2024, 9am–11am to provide feedback around challenges and areas of improvement, reflect on key areas of growth and celebrate accomplishments.
- In agreement with your mentee, continue the mentoring program into a second year with the possibility of working with a new mentee as well.

The Bureau will notify selected mentors of their acceptance by Wednesday, March 1, 2023.

If selected, mentors are eligible for up to \$4,000 for their participation in the program for each assigned mentee. In order to participate, mentors must be able to enter into contract with the NHED as a vendor. Vendors are required to have personal automobile insurance and professional liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000. The Bureau has incorporated the cost of the insurance, as well as travel, in the hourly wage of \$75.00 for trainings and monthly contact with their assigned mentee(s) for the contract period.

The mentees will self-select to participate. Preferences will be given to individuals who have less than one year of experience. The application for self-selection of mentees will be sent to Superintendents and Special Education Administrators on Monday, March 13, 2023. The Bureau will accept mentee applications through Monday, April 10, 2023, or until the twelve mentee limit has been reached.
