APH Federal Quota Census Training

In accordance with the 1879 Federal Act to Promote the Education of the Blind, the New Hampshire Department of Education (NHED) is preparing to launch the 2025 American Printing House for the Blind (APH) Federal Quota Census. Each year, APH funding for each state is determined by the number of eligible infants, toddlers, school age students, and adult students registered on the Federal Quota. ***Individuals may be determined eligible because they meet or function at the definition of blindness OR because they qualify under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) definition of visual impairment “an impairment in vision, that, even with correction, adversely affects a child’s educational performance” (34 CFR §300.8(c)(13)).***

The registration process for the 2025 APH Federal Quota Census will be completed entirely online through [myNHDOE](#) beginning Monday, January 6, 2025, through Monday, February 24, 2025. **District of Liability SPED Administrators, FCESS Administrators, and Charter School Administrators or 504 Coordinators** will be the only authorized officials responsible for registering eligible individuals. In preparation for the online registration process, we encourage collaboration with the Teacher of the Visually Impaired (TVI), Certified Orientation & Mobility Specialist, or Vision Coordinator working with your district or agency to ensure that all eligible individuals, both new and continuing, are registered on the 2025 APH Federal Quota.
