REPORT OF OUT-OF-STATE MEETINGS

No attendance at out-of-state meetings since May 8, 2018.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT/OFFICE ISSUES/OTHER

We anticipate onboarding our new Administrator for the Veterans Education Services and the Office of Career School Licensing.

COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY ACTIVITY

We were notified by the New England Board of Higher Education that the State of Massachusetts was approved by the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements, effective June 7, 2018. It will start accepting applications from institutions.

In-State Colleges and Universities:

A NEASC Focused Evaluation was held from May 6 to 8, 2018 at the **New Hampshire Institute of Art.** Dr. Richard Gustafson served as the Commission's observer.

On Tuesday, May 29, 2018, presidents of **New England College** and the **New Hampshire Institute of Art** announced they hope to merge by October 1, 2018, an action that would strengthen the two and allow a single organization to address upcoming challenges facing higher education. They are working with us to ensure compliance with our laws and rules. This will be on the Commission agenda.

St. Joseph School of Nursing received notification from the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC) informing the School that it deferred final action on its Application for Renewal of Accreditation until the August 2018 meeting in order to provide the school with an additional opportunity to demonstrate compliance with its accrediting standards. The ACCSC requested the School submit another report before July 31, 2018. We are in receipt of the report.

Out-of-State Colleges and Universities:

Administrative Approvals for Online Programs:

Administrative approval is granted to institutions within states that are not members of the National Council – State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) or have elected to not participate through NC-SARA to operate in New Hampshire and offer online degrees that require a practicum/internship/clinical. These institutions are as follows:

- **Boston University** (Boston, MA), accredited by the NEASC was approved to offer the Fellowship in Orthopaedic Manual Physical Therapy until June 30, 2020.
- Simmons College (Boston, MA) accredited by the NEASC was approved to offer the Registered Nurse to Master of Science in Nursing (RN to MSN) and Master of Science in Behavior Analysis until June 30, 2020.

CLOSED SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS

From July 1, 2017 until May 31, 2018 (FY 2018), **2,299** college/university transcripts and **59** career school transcripts were processed, generating a total of **\$47,160**. During the same period in the prior year (FY 2017), a total of **2,148** college/university transcripts and **62** career school transcripts were processed, generating a total of **\$44,200**. We no longer verify credentials via the telephone from third parties and this is contributing to our increase in fees received.
