STAFF DEVELOPMENT/OFFICE ISSUES/OTHER

On June 21, 2018, Jeffrey S. Newman joined the Division as our new Administrator for the Veterans Education Services and the Office of Career School Licensing. Jeff will work to expand educational opportunities for veterans and their dependents.

COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY ACTIVITY

In-State Colleges and Universities:

The American University of Madaba has submitted a request for two new degrees – a Bachelor of Arts in Design and Visual Communication and a Bachelor of Arts in Human Resources Management. The University is currently authorized to grant the following degrees until December 31, 2019:

An Annual Report is due by March 1, 2019 updating institutional progress, including:

- The progress on attaining Candidacy status with the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, including the provision for copies of all correspondence and reports to/from the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Copies of these documents shall be provided to the Commission as they are submitted or received throughout the year.
- Progress on implementing student government organizations at the University.

An administrative review will be held in the near future for these two new degrees.

Hellenic American University submitted a copy of its Lease Agreement with 436 AMHERST, LLC, a Delaware Limited Liability Company, 50 Salem Street, Lynnfield, MA for the premises located at 505 Amherst Street, Nashua, NH 03063. The term of the lease shall be for a period of thirty-seven (37) months beginning on August 1, 2018 and ending on August 31, 2021 for 9,146 square feet.

St. Joseph School of Nursing forwarded a letter from the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges informing them their Commission voted to grant Renewal of Accreditation for a period of three (3) years going forward from July 2017 or 2020.

To align with industry standards and in keeping with its mission, **Southern New Hampshire University** changed the degree name of the Master of Science in Public Health to a Master of Public Health.

New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE) Activity:

The U.S. Department of Education has officially transferred the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) federal recognition to a new corporation, the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE), effective August 1, 2018. It now meets the federal requirement that it be "separate and independent" of any other organization and is the regional accreditor for the six New England states.

The NECHE conducted a Comprehensive Evaluation site visit to **Southern New Hampshire University** on September 23 – 26, 2018 with Dr. Sue Ann Huseman, past president of the University of Maine at Farmington, Monmouth College (Illinois), University of Maine at Machias, and the former Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs, University of Maine System serving as the Higher Education Commission observer.

From the observer's perspective, the University is a world class institution uniquely positioned to carry out its high-minded mission of providing top quality support and education to students for whom college is not a guarantee and to do so regardless of the students' circumstances. The passionate commitment of everyone she met to this mission and to the students they serve was inspiring, and the enthusiasm and praise of students for the quality of support and education they receive and its transformative impact on their lives was heartwarming. She had not encountered an institution of higher education with a greater commitment to providing students access to quality education and supporting learner success, and believes that the University's commitment to and capacity for data generation and analysis to improve student support and student learning is unparalleled.

All Higher Education Commission standards were met and results will be heard at the NECHE November 15-16, 2018 meeting.

Out-of-State Colleges and Universities:

MCPHS University forwarded materials from the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education on the Master of Science in Occupational Therapy.

Easton Education – Canada – has requested information on how to operate in New Hampshire and offer baccalaureate and master level programs. This is a private, for profit institution.

Florence University of the Arts (FUA) – Florence, Italy, has asked and received information regarding the process for establishing itself in New Hampshire. FUA was established in 1997, and has over 3,000 students from 40 countries. FUA "was organized since its inception along the lines of a US-style higher education institution with instruction in English language".

Holy Spirit University of Kaslik (USEK) – Jounieh, Lebanon – The provost, Dr. Georges Yahchouchi, contacted our office regarding the possibility of incorporation in New Hampshire as a foreign based university. They are a private Catholic higher education institution founded by the Lebanese Maronite Order (LMO) in 1938. It is a multilingual institution, French and English speaking, that officially adopted the American-style education in 2015. There were over 7,000 students enrolled last year and 875 faculty members.

Oduduwa University – Nigeria – has requested information on how to seek approval to operate in New Hampshire. It has incorporated "Our Saviors University" in Wilmington, DE so that Oduduwa University can trade as "Our Saviors University"; that is the certificate that will be issued shall be that of Oduduwa University in Nigeria and not a US certificate. They wish to open a Concord office.

VETERANS EDUCATION SERVICES

Veterans Education Services (VES) is the New Hampshire State Approving Agency that approves all facilities and programs that are subject to funding under the GI Bill®. This includes institutes of higher learning, high schools, non-college degree programs and certificates, on-the-job training and apprenticeships. This includes traditional college study and workforce development programs. Currently, there are approximately 6,000 veterans and dependents in New Hampshire involved in various programs and courses of study subject to the GI Bill®.

Below are some of the activities the VES team accomplished from June 1, 2018 through September 30, 2018:

 Approved and completed the Fiscal Year 19 Cooperative Agreement base year contract with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs to authorize and fund VES office and activities in New Hampshire.

- Received training on the current status of the law and implementation of the Forever GI Bill® Harry W. Colmery Veterans Educational Assistance Act.
- Worked with New Hampshire Military Leadership Team and New Hampshire National Guard Scholarship Committee to discuss status of statewide veterans programs, initiatives, and dispersal of funds.
- Facilitated an audit by The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs officials reviewing our operations and providing best practices for successful operations.
- Conducted eleven new facility site visits including: Freel and Son Electric LLC, Rines Electric LLC, DMG MORI, JP Carter. Wolfeboro Municipal Electric Department, the police departments of the towns of Lee, Hanover and Haverhill, Unique System Skills LLC and Laird Institute of Spa Therapy.
