#### Components of the Accountability System

There are many components of the federal accountability system. The long-term/interim goals guide te statewide effort to support all New Hampshire schools and students. Schools in need of the most support are identified by measuring certain indicators required under ESSA. The indicator data are reported publicly on the State Report Card for all students and subgroups. Identified schools receive technical assistance and other support to improve their performance. To protect students' perisonally identifiable information, data points that do not meet the minimum n-size of 11 are suppressed.

Welcome to the New Hampshire Department of Education's iPlatform 9.75 for education data stories from

schools/districts. The concept behind this portal is to enhance transparency and stimulate community conversations with parents, districts, legislators, and others about the state of their local school systems. We all have a stake in the success of our K-12 education system and we all share the common aspiration of well-educated students. As article 83 of the New Hampshire Constitution states, "Knowledge and learning, generally diffused through a community, being essential to the preservation of a free government; and spreading the opportunities and advantages of education through the various parts of the country, being highly conducive to promote this end."

While we all share the same goal of creating bright futures for Granite State students, how that is accomplished may vary. We fiercely believe in local control of education; each community shapes unique student educational experiences. No one data point is adequate to tell the story of an educational experience.

This portal includes a broad – and expanding – range of information to create the opportunity for community conversations. It is comprised of four areas designed to help you get the information you need. #### iAchieve - NEW 2023 Data!

An online dashboard that includes Assessment Participation, Proficiency and Growth, Achievement Levels, and ESSA Indicators, designed to help educators make data-driven decisions and improve student outcomes. The Assessment Participation section displays participation rates and identifies areas of concern. Proficiency and Growth tracks student performance over time to identify areas for additional support. Achievement Levels shows the percentage of students meeting expectations, while ESSA Indicators provide a holistic view of student progress in relation to ESSA requirements.

#### <u>iGrant</u>

An interactive ESSER dashboard that highlights various data such as allocations, spending information, and paid reimbursements by school districts. This dashboard also showcases the top activities where districts are spending their ESSER funds. The data within this dashboard is pulled directly from the NHED grants management system (GMS), and updates weekly. iGrant is a great resource to provide a snapshot of the actual ESSER spending for each school. More information, definitions, and resources can be found within the dashboard.

#### iReport - NEW 2023 Data!

Includes static information about individual schools and school districts that comprises the accountability data elements included in the New Hampshire federal accountability plan under the Every Student Succeeds Act. This is a great source to get a quick snapshot of a particular school or district.

#### iExplore - NEW 2023 Data!

Includes more dynamic information about individual schools and comparative tools between schools, districts, and state level information. More advanced comparisons are made between data with drill down capability. At this point, iExplore is driven by 15 identified data elements. This list will continue to grow as the NH DOE adds additional exploration metrics, helping communities explore and engage in discussions about education in their communities. iExplore is a great source for more in-depth analysis of what's going on in a school, district, or across the state.



Each spring, students in grades 3-8 and 11 take the NH State Assessments in English Language Arts, Math and Science (grades 4,8,11). Academic Achievement in NH is measured by examining both student performance and student participation. Only students who spend most of the year enrolled in a given school are included when reporting the performance of students. Additionally, to ensure all students participate, schools are held accountable for a portion of students who did not take the test.




#### **Assessment Proficiency in Context**

Proficiency as compared with the district (including all schools in the district) as well as the state of NH (including all schools) across all three subject areas.









Navigating	<ul> <li>Start with State or Portsmouth School District.</li> <li>Read the text, it helps!</li> <li>Use of ranges (blurring), *N; N/A;</li> <li>Look for hovering - lots of great detail</li> <li>Click to expand, click again to close (eg. school search)</li> <li>Data Definitions brings you to a new glossary of terms</li> </ul>
Assessment Participation	<ul> <li>Explain Four sections</li> <li>Participation - what percentage of students required to test, did test. Hover for subgroups rates over 3 years</li> <li>FAY Count and Rate - What percent of students who were required to test were enrolled for at least 90% of the year</li> <li>This FAY gives you an idea of mobility. If most students required to test, were FAY, then most of your students are enrolled all year and not transient</li> <li>Identify percent of students who did <u>not</u> test and look at that by subgroup.</li> <li>Then considering <u>just the students who did not test</u> look at the distribution of those students ("Breakdown of Students Not tested")</li> <li>Show participation filter for females - first show hover then filter and they should match</li> <li>Then filter for grade</li> <li>Could show an elementary growth tab and filter for grade 3</li> </ul>





Proficiency & Growth	<ul> <li>Explain Four sections</li> <li>Percent proficient (same as iReport) - hover for longitudinal and explain interim current and longitudinal targets</li> <li>Same thing for Growth percentiles</li> <li>Cohort charts - one for each subject; both achievement and growth</li> <li>Follow a cohort of students diagonally from older year to more recent and from lower grade higher (note: not perfect cohort) see image on this slide.</li> <li>Ability to look at achievement as percent proficient <u>or</u> scaled score (not scaled scores are different for each grade)</li> <li>Note that scaled score is not same range each year. So look across a single grade.</li> </ul>
Achievement Levels	<ul> <li>Point out Achievement and Growth current year (top two sections)</li> <li>Achievement and Growth over time (bottom sections)</li> <li>Hover top left (Achievement) to see where these students 'came from' what level in prior year.</li> <li>Realize that top right (Growth) shows MGP for this year's levels. So you would expect L4 would have higher SGP, because it includes students who moved up to 4. No one moved down to 4. Where as L3 has lowest SGP, because it includes folks who dropped.</li> <li>Hover over 'dot' in bottom left (Achievement over time) to see if one subgroup outperformed another for a given level.</li> <li>Click on a level in the title bar (over achievement and growth over time) to limit to the one level (note: Click again to reselect all).</li> </ul>


