Executive Summary

A. Action Needed

Landaff School Board – Blue School Innovation Plan Application

State Board of Education,

This report has been prepared and is being submitted by the New Hampshire Department of Education (NHED) Administrator of Educational Pathways to the New Hampshire State Board of Education (SBOE) to summarize the process followed, and the information provided by, the Landaff School District and the Landaff School Board in requesting SBOE approval of their Innovation School Plan application (application) for the "Blue School". The application has been prepared and submitted in general accordance with the requirements of NHED rule Ed 1500 – Innovation Schools.

Application and Review Process

- The Landaff School Board submitted its initial application for the Blue School to NHED on November 1, 2023. In accordance with Ed 1501.04(b), NHED completed a review of the application and had two virtual meetings to provide feedback to the School District and a representative of the Landaff School Board. Based on the feedback provided by NHED, the initial application was withdrawn from consideration on November 16, 2023. For purpose of brevity, neither the content nor the reasons for the withdrawal of the initial application will be discussed further.
- In accordance with Ed 1501.02(a), the Landaff School District submitted a revised application to the Landaff School Board for consideration.
- In accordance with Ed 1501.03(a) the Landaff School Board held the required public hearing on October 30, 2023. A copy of the required public hearing notice is attached.

- In accordance with Ed 1501.03(b)(1) the Landaff School Board voted to approve the revised application and to seek designation from the SBOE under Ed 1501.04. A copy of the draft Landaff School Board meeting minutes is attached.
- The Landaff School Board submitted the locally approved revised application to NHED on November 22, 2023. In accordance with Ed 1501.04(b). NHED completed a review of the revised application and offered no additional comments. A copy of the locally approved revised application is attached.

Potential SBOE Actions

In accordance with Ed 1503.04(e), the SBOE shall either approve or reject the locally approved application. If the SBOE approves the application, the Landaff School District may implement the innovation(s) as delineated in the application. If the innovation plan is rejected by the SBOE, the Landaff School Board may resubmit an amended application to NHED at any time after rejection.

Future Performance Review

If the application is approved, Ed 1501.05 requires that two years after the date of approval the Landaff School Board shall a complete performance review of the innovation plan and submit the results of that review to NHED. NHED will also complete a review of the Landaff School Board submittal and provide feedback as necessary. Following completion of NHED's review, the Landaff School Board Chair, or designee, shall provide a presentation to the SBOE at a regularly scheduled meeting.

Landaff has had a rich history of education dating back to the formation of Dartmouth College which was originally intended to be located in Landaff, to the continual use of our historical Blue School, a one room school house since 1858 currently educating 13 preschool students and 13 students in grades K-4. The mission of the Blue School is "to form a partnership with parents and the community to prepare all students to become lifelong learners in a safe environment with high expectations so that they will become responsible, productive citizens that reach their full potential in an ever-changing society." Having this unique grade-span, multi-aged one room school house offers social and emotional benefits that do not happen in a regular school setting, including mentoring and academic support from the older students to the younger students, in preschool-first grade. It also allows Landaff's Head Teacher to target individual instruction according to student ability, not grade or age. The Blue School has and will continue to meet this mission, while ensuring our vision to develop responsible and ethical citizens who are academically, socially, and physically prepared to meet and shape the future of our community and society as a whole.

RSA 194-E:2. III

- (a) The mission of the Blue School is "to form a partnership with parents and the community to prepare all students to become lifelong learners in a safe environment with high expectations so that they will become responsible, productive citizens that reach their full potential in an ever-changing society." Designation as an innovation school will enhance the Blue's School's ability to achieve this mission by forgoing certain staff credentials in an effort to continue hiring effective and engaging employees. The plan will outline how we currently implement creative and inventive strategies to maintain student achievement and reduce targeted gaps, mostly due to Covid-19 Pandemic.
- (b) The innovations in school staffing that are currently in place to meet minimum standards of NH Code Admin.R. Ed 306.15 include:

The Blue School continues to provide the services of a principal by hiring a Blue School Head Teacher, with a Masters Degree in Elementary Education and a license for Elementary Education K-8, Special Education K-12. The current Head Teacher has been the administrator of these duties effectively since 2015, without a N.H. Department of Education Principal's License, however, with SAU 35 support from the Business Administrator and Superintendent, principal roles and responsibilities have been met. The current Head Teacher holds an Experience Elementary School Educators license, as well as a license in K-12 Special Education, and has earned a Masters in Education K-8.

- (c) We are requesting a waiver of the above provision of staff and staff qualifications listed in N.H. Code Admin. Ed 306.15, based on the effectiveness of the Blue School providing innovative, alternative services which meet the needs of our students. Under the leadership and instruction of the Head Teacher, for almost 10 years, Landaff Blue School elementary students have effectively transitioned to Lisbon Regional School, Lafayette Elementary School, Profile School, White Mountain School, Saint Johnsbury Academy and schools in SAU23. Despite the pandemic, the SAS results from 2021-2022 show 100% of our 3rd graders are proficient in math, 60% at level 3 and 40% at level 4; 80% of our 3rd graders are proficient, 40% at level 4. The school did not have any 4th graders during this school year. In the 2022-2023 school year, 100% of all 3rd and 4th graders were proficient in math. 75% of the 3rd grade students were proficient in reading and 72% of the 4th grade were proficient in reading. In addition, during the last ten years, the Landaff resident seniors graduation rate is 100%.
- (d) The Blue School programs, operational documents and Landaff School District policies are not affected by this innovative plan.
- (e) The 2022 IReport shows that the New Hampshire state average for math in 3rd grade was 51%; and 4th grade was 48%. The 2022 IReport shows that the New Hampshire state average for English Language Arts in 3rd grade was 45% and 4th grade was 48%. The Blue School will continue to show high academic performance, as indicated by the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 NH SAS results. Please refer to the chart below.

Acadience Assessment- Acadience measures the indication of academic success. It helps teachers and schools determine how students are performing on important reading skills. These measures are designed for students in grades K-6. DIBELS is used to identify children who may need extra help to become good readers and check up on those children while they receive the extra help to make sure they are making progress. **Acadience is a timed assessment.**

- (f) By implementing these innovations the district has had a cost savings in the General Budget under function code 2410 School Administration Salary and Benefits. Despite these cost savings, the Blue School cost per pupil on 2022 was \$33,114.00, over \$10,000.00 more than the average New Hampshire cost per pupil. Hiring additional staff would further increase that per pupil cost. The average Elementary School Principal salary in New Hampshire is \$78,688 as of October 25, 2023, but the range typically falls between \$69,954 and \$89,242.
- (g) Landaff Blue School is blessed to have an extremely high level of support from the small rural community with a total population under 500. For the last ten years, the Landaff School District has voted to raise and appropriate funds asked to support the Blue School for the payment of salaries and statutory obligations of the district. In addition, other school warrant articles, including appropriating funds for Technology, Tuition, Building and Special Education Trust Funds have also been supported by the taxpayers present at the District Annual Meeting.
- (h) Landaff Blue School does not have a collective bargaining agreement.
- (i) Additional information is not required by the local school board of the Landaff School District to implement this Blue School Innovation Plan. However, multiple verbal conversations by community and parents with school board members, as well as the Blue School Head Teacher, indicate overwhelming support for this Innovation Plan as it allows the Landaff Blue School, built in 1858, to continue to educate the children of Landaff, in the only one of six remaining one-room school house.
