# Lean into Literacy LETRS Stipend Policy

The New Hampshire Department of Education (NHED) is offering stipends to eligible participants of the NHED sponsored Lean into Literacy, two-year LETRS<sup>®</sup> program for Elementary Educators or the one-year LETRS<sup>®</sup> for Early Childhood Educators (ECE) program.

## Eligibility requirements for the NHED stipend include:

- Officially enrolled in either the NHED sponsored:
  - Two-year LETRS<sup>®</sup> program for Elementary Educators, or
  - One-year LETRS<sup>®</sup> for Early Childhood Educators (ECE) program.
- Employed by a NH public, public chartered, or private school.

#### For participants to receive a \$500 stipend, the following is required:

- LETRS<sup>®</sup> mastery level score of 80% on Posttest for (Units 1-4) or
- LETRS® ECE mastery level score of 80% on Posttest for (Units 1-4)
- Complete online and offline coursework,
- Attend live-virtual trainings

## For participants to receive an additional \$500 stipend, the following is required:

- Officially enrolled in the NHED sponsored LETRS® Volume 2, Units 5-8
- LETRS<sup>®</sup> mastery level score of 80% on Posttest for (Units 5-8)
- Complete online and offline coursework
- Attend live-virtual trainings

Payment of stipends will be provided and conducted through a third-party vendor, procured by NHED, that will verify eligibility for stipend. Current pay stub or verification from current employer will be required. Completion of a W-9 will be required from all applicants for stipends.

#### Limitations:

- Only eligible to participants enrolled in the <u>NHED sponsored</u> two-year LETRS<sup>®</sup> program for Elementary Educators or the one-year LETRS<sup>®</sup> for Early Childhood Educators (ECE) program.
- Administrator Lexia training is not eligible for payment of stipend.
- NHED will not be responsible for any fees associated with retakes of posttest(s).
