

# **New Hampshire School Designations for Fall 2022**

#### **Comprehensive Support and Improvement Schools**

Comprehensive support and Improvement (CSI) schools are the lowest-performing five percent of all schools in the state receiving Title I, Part A funds and all high schools in the state with a 4-year graduation rate less than 67%, regardless of the Title I status.
