Changing the Invitation: Broadening the Number and Diversity of AP Students through AP Precalculus and AP Seminar

AP Precalculus

The 2023-24 school year was the first full-year launch of the **AP Precalculus** course. **75% of students nationwide received a qualifying score of 3+**. Making your existing Precalculus course an AP course will create value in the following ways:

- **AP students are galvanized by the opportunity to earn college credit.** They are typically more motivated in an AP class to devote the time and effort to the focus and practice that math proficiency demands.
- AP Precalculus provides students with **140 hours of contact time with their instructor**. In comparison, students who take precalculus in college typically receive 48 hours of contact.
- **AP Precalculus meets students where they are**, in the familiar environment of a high school classroom, and provides free online practice and videos that you can tailor to individual students' needs for additional help.

AP Seminar

As an English course taught in the AP Seminar style, English 10: AP Seminar is designed to help **students develop foundational skills in writing, collaboration, research, and presentation**. These skills are essential for future success in high school, college, and career, and the course can be offered through any academic department. **86% of students nationwide received a qualifying score of 3+** on the 2024 AP Seminar exam.

AP Seminar has broad benefits including:

- **Engaging a wide range of students:** The project-based learning model makes the course more relevant for more students. A more diverse group of students take and are successful in AP Seminar than any other AP course.
- **Building relevant skills:** Students build skills foundational to college and career success, including investigating topics, conducting research, and presenting. They work in teams to investigate a real-world or academic problem and present an argument for their proposed solution.
- **Improving outcomes:** Taking AP Seminar in grade 10 sets students up for future high school success.
