Digital Readiness Check

College Board strongly recommends that school test coordinators collaborate with technology coordinators to schedule the Digital Readiness Check 1–2 weeks before each test administration.

Note: This check must also be completed before any retests.

During the Digital Readiness Check, students will:

1. Sign into Bluebook using their sign-in tickets.
2. Review the Test Day Checklist.
3. Confirm device readiness.
4. Complete Exam Setup, which includes:
 - a. Reviewing test taker rules
 - b. Providing optional test taker information
 - c. Adding Free Score Sends

The Digital Readiness Check familiarizes students with Bluebook before test day. It allows students to confirm their registration information and accommodations in advance, ultimately saving time on test day. Preparing Your Students for the SAT with Essay

- **[SAT School Day with Essay Website/ Digital Practice Tests in Bluebook](#):** Students aged 13 and older with a College Board account can access full-length practice tests in Bluebook. This allows students to familiarize themselves with the tools and features they will encounter on test day. Students can log into My Practice to access their practice test score results and details from ANY practice test.
 - **[Khan Academy Official SAT School Day Practice](#):** Through a direct partnership with College Board, students gain access to a number of resources in Khan Academy including practice questions, videos, lessons, helpful hints, and valuable test-taking tips.

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Remind Students and Families About the BigFuture® School App

BigFuture School is a free mobile app that provides students with the power to:

- View scores from the PSAT/NMSQT®, PSAT 10™, and SAT® School Day
- Explore customized college and career planning guidance
- Hear from nonprofit colleges, scholarship providers, and government agency education programs through Connections™
- BigFuture School and Connections put students' privacy first. No personal information is shared with any institution unless a student chooses to share information directly with them.

How It Works

- Remind students to provide a mobile number During the exam setup, students can provide a mobile number that is only used to access and authenticate the app.
- Encourage students to check their scores in the app: Students can view their scores, including career insights, to jumpstart their college and career exploration.
- Students who don't provide a number or don't download the app can receive their PDF score report from schools or log in to their College Board account.
