Technical Assistance:

Documenting Testing Exceptions for the Statewide Assessments

NHED has released a new reporting feature as part of the online i4see student information system managed within the <u>myNHDOE</u> platform. This new feature allows a more efficient and secure way for test coordinators and/or school administrators to report the following:

- Test Security Incidents
- Assessment Exemptions
 - o Parent Opt-out
 - EL Domain Exemption ACCESS Test Only
- Special Considerations Waivers
- Special Use Accommodations
 - Calculator Math (grades 3-6)
 - Multiplication Table Math (grades 3-8)
 - Read Aloud
 - Text-to-Speech ELA Reading

This guidance provides an overview of the scenarios listed above, all of which involve some level of reporting to NHED. Additional information and policy guidance is addressed in the New Hampshire Department of Education Assessment Policy and Procedures Manual.

Test Security Incidents

NHED acknowledges that in rare circumstances test security incidents occur. Most test incidents should be documented and reported to NHED as soon as possible through the Testing Exceptions online reporting feature via the i4see system described on page 5.

Technology Incident

A few examples:

- School loses internet access
- Power outage during a test session
- Technical issues with the school network, or related issues.

An unusual circumstance that affects an individual or group of students who are testing and may potentially affect student performance on the test, test security or test validity.

A few examples:

- A student not receiving an accommodation on the assessment that is documented in IEP/504 plan.
- Disruptions to a test session such as a fire alarm/drill.
- Student(s) making distracting gestures/sounds or talking during the test session that creates a disruption.
- Test administrators leaving related instructional support material on the walls in testing room.

Test Security Violation

An incident or breach of New Hampshire's test security policies and procedures that compromises test security, data security, and the integrity of a student's or students' assessment results. These circumstances have external implications and must be reported immediately.

A few examples:

- Testing staff modifying a student's response on the assessment.
- Individuals posting test items or materials on social media.
- Improper removal of test materials from testing environment.
- Adults or students copying, discussing, or retaining test items for any reason, before, during, or after testing is finished.

Assessment Exemptions

Parent Opt-Out—NHSAS, DLM or SAT Only

Under RSA 193-C:6, New Hampshire permits parents to opt-out their public school student from participating in the required statewide assessments. Parents must submit a completed Parent Opt-Out form to the school.

Schools may document parent opt-outs through the Assessment Roster in the i4see system. Schools are not required to upload the completed forms but must keep a copy on file locally for 3 years and have available upon request of NHED during Assessment Monitoring.

EL Domain Exemption—ACCESS Test Only

In rare cases, an English learner may have a disability that precludes assessment of the student in one or more of the required language domains (listening, speaking, reading, or writing) such that there are no appropriate accommodations for the affected domain(s). If this is the case, the student's IEP/504 team may request a domain exemption via the online reporting process described on the next page.

Examples:

- A non-verbal student who is unable to participate in Speaking domain.
- A student who is deaf or hard of hearing may not be able to participate in the Listening/Speaking domain.

This special exemption must be documented on the student's IEP/504 plan and the EL Domain exemption must be uploaded to **Testing Exceptions** in the i4see system.

Special Considerations Waiver

A special considerations waiver may be appropriate in rare and unique situations when a student is unable to participate in any part of the statewide assessments. A special considerations waiver may be submitted to NHED for consideration under the following circumstances:

- Medical emergency/serious illness
- Severe emotional distress
- Death in the family
- Student participating in another state's assessment system

Schools are expected to document special considerations waivers via the online reporting process described on the next page. Schools upload the completed waiver form but must keep a copy on file locally for three (3) years and have available upon request of NHED during Assessment Monitoring.



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
How to Access the Testing Exceptions Reporting Feature in the i4see System

1. Log into <u>myNHDOE</u> > i4see and choose the Assessment Roster.




2. Once logged in, make sure you have selected the "All" roster list from the top buttons.



3. To document a testing exception, go to the "Testing Exceptions" column, click the (+) symbol that corresponds with the student.



4. The **Submit a Testing Exception** online form will appear. Select a *Testing Exception Type* from the dropdown menu, complete all fields in the form, and click *'Submit Request.'*



Instructions for each Testing Exception:

Test Security Incidents	Documentation does not need to be uploaded with the online form. Provide a short description. Documentation must be kept on file locally and be made available upon request of NHED during Assessment Monitoring.
Parent Opt-Out	The completed Parent Opt-Out form does not need to be uploaded with the online form. Completed forms must be kept on file locally and be made available upon request of NHED during Assessment Monitoring.
EL Domain Exemption	The domain exemption must be documented in the student's IEP or 504 Plan. Documentation does not need to be uploaded with the online form. Documentation must be kept on file locally and be made available upon request of NHED during Assessment Monitoring.
Special Considerations Waiver	Completed Special Considerations Waiver forms must be uploaded when requesting a special considerations waiver. Completed forms also must be kept on file locally and be made available upon request of NHED during Assessment Monitoring.
Special Use Accommodation	Documentation does not need to be uploaded with the online form; however, please provide the specific special use accommodation being used for NH SAS testing. NHED does not need to approve Special Use Accommodations. It is for notification purposes only.

- 5. The Assessment Team will review and contact the school with any questions.
- 6. To check on status of the request, users can also return to the Assessment Roster and click the 'i' symbol under the 'Testing Exceptions' dropdown menu.

<u>Note</u>: Click the column title "Testing Exceptions" to sort so the 'i' symbol (submitted requests) appear at the top of the list. You may have to click twice to activate the sorting feature.
